Friday, 20.September.2024 - Day 0

We'll bid farewell to Delhi, our capital, and board a flight towards the captivating realm of Ice and Fire.

Saturday, 21.September.2024 - Day 1

Upon arrival in Iceland, we'll complete the immigration process, collect our luggage, and board the Skybus bound for our initial destination: Reykjavik, the vibrant capital city of Iceland.

Tonight, we'll settle into a charming motel, unpack, and prepare ourselves for the exhilarating adventure that awaits in the days ahead. In addition, we'll seize the chance to explore some of Reykjavik's iconic

landmarks, including the majestic Hallgrimskirkja, Iceland's tallest building, capturing its beauty during the enchanting blue hour. We'll also pay a visit to the renowned Sun Voyager sculpture.

Sunday, 22.September.2024 - Day 2

We'll collect our camper and set course for Skógafoss, our primary photography destination for the day. En route, we'll make captivating stops at Seljalandsfoss, Gljufrabui, and Kvernufoss. This marks our inaugural night in the camper, and we've chosen to stay at the Skógafoss camping ground. This strategic choice offers us prime opportunities to capture one of these breathtaking waterfalls bathed in the golden light of the day, as well as potentially witnessing the mesmerizing northern lights.



Monday, 23.September.2024 - Day 3

After a beautiful sunrise shoot and a good breakfast, we'll head to the stunning Jökulsárlón glacier lagoon. Along the way, we'll make quick stops at Vik church, Foss á Síðu, and Svínafellsjökull glacier viewpoint. If conditions allow, we might visit Múlagljúfur Canyon, though this depends on weather and group fitness.

This day promises wonder, especially if the aurora forecast is good. We'll be out capturing moments from sunset to sunrise. The sunset and northern lights will be over the glacier lagoon, while the sunrise will paint the diamond beach with a magical light, making icebergs look like diamonds on dark sand.



Tuesday, 24.September.2024 - Day 4

Continuing on the scenic Route 1, our next destination is the awe-inspiring Vestrahorn. Given our night-long photography session the previous day, we'll take this opportunity to ease the pace, allowing ourselves some well-deserved rest in anticipation of another extraordinary sunset-to-sunrise shoot. Nestled at the Vestrahorn Campsite, we'll enjoy the convenience of direct access to the striking black beach, providing us with flexibility for our photographic endeavors. Additionally, we might explore the Viking village for a casual, enriching experience.



Wednesday, 25.September.2024 - Day 5

Today, we're off to witness the might of Dettifoss, Iceland's largest waterfall and the second largest in Europe. We'll explore its grandeur from various angles, aiming to capture nature's raw power in the most captivating light.



Thursday, 26.September.2024 - Day 6

Today, we're heading to the northernmost point of Iceland, where the Northern Lights display their full splendor. The Arctic Henge awaits.

Friday, 27.September.2024 - Day 7

After a long drive and a night of photography, we'll head straight to a campsite to recharge. Along the way, we'll explore the intriguing geothermal activity at Hverir. A few hours before sunset, we'll make a stop at the majestic Godafoss. If the aurora forecast is in our favor, we might embark on another sunset-to-sunrise adventure.



Saturday, 28.September.2024 - Day 8

Following breakfast, we'll head to a picturesque campsite for a leisurely lunch. Just before sunset, we'll make our way to the stunning sea arch of Hvitserkur. Depending on the forecast, we might extend our photography session into the night, capturing moments till the break of dawn.



Sunday, 29.September.2024 - Day 9

Off to western Iceland today! Our first stop: Kirkjufellsfoss, renowned for its stunning Northern Lights displays. We'll explore Kirkjufellsfoss, the iconic black church Schwarze Kirche, and Gatklettur. Though, depending on time, we might have to choose two out of the three.



Monday, 30.September.2023 - Day 10

Today marks our return to Reykjavik. We'll bid farewell to our trusty camper, settling back into the same welcoming motel we started our adventure in. After finalizing our packing for our early morning flight, we'll seize our last opportunity to capture the Northern Lights from Reykjavik's vantage point. To culminate this extraordinary journey through the land of ice and fire, we'll savor a delightful celebration at a charming Indian restaurant.

Tuesday, 01.October.2024 - Day 11

At the break of dawn, we'll board the Flybus to Keflavik Airport, bidding a fond farewell to Iceland.

For those in search of inspiration, gaze upon this brief masterpiece. A cinematic voyage crafted by one of our mentors during an immersive eight-week sojourn through Iceland's secret realms, where nature's wonders reveal themselves in exquisite obscurity.

- Our team of mentors includes individuals with extensive experience in conducting photography workshops both within and outside of India. They have a proven track record of success and have achieved numerous accolades in the field of photography. - ➤ Unlike most conventional trips, we don't adhere strictly to a set itinerary. The above is for an indication. Reason is the notorious and fast changing weather of Iceland. 100 kmph wind, days of cloud cover, hours of ran are very common in this tiny island in the middle of Atlantic. Nature photography in Iceland is not the same as any other places in the world. It is a hostile place for photography. Good news is that Iceland has a very local weather pattern. Means you can have horrible weather at the place you are in whereas 100 km away can have glittering sunshine. Exactly the reason why we stay in a camper to keep ourselves mobile all the time and follow the weather to give us opportunity for the best light.
- Some may call it crazy, but there are always those dedicated souls who brave the wind and cold all night for that fleeting moment of glory. We recognize that not everyone is up for such an adventure, and that's where the camper becomes our savior. Thankfully, most parking spots are conveniently located near our desired photo locations. So, if fatigue sets in, a rejuvenating power nap is just a short distance away, ensuring you're ready for more. Additionally, we can take shifts, stationed with our cameras poised to capture any shifts in light, ready to alert others if conditions take a turn.
- > We uphold the principle of valuing quality over quantity, firmly believing that a solitary image capable of etching itself into our memories forever possesses far greater significance than a multitude of fleeting shots we may never revisit.

Camera Gear

- A DSLR or Mirrorless camera.
- Spare batteries (at least 4 batteries), memory cards, and charging system.
- Type E European outlet adaptor. Even better if you have an universal adapter.
- Fast aperture lens (at least f/2.8) and another telephoto lens like Nikon 24-120, 18-140, Canon 24-105, 18-105 etc.
- A steady Tripod.
- 10 stop or 6 stop ND filters for long exposure photography and a CPL filter is helpful for landscape photography. A GND filter is useful for golden hour photography.

Trip Cost

EUR 2,100 per person (Around 180,000 INR). Rs. 60,000 down payment necessary to secure your place. Paid in INR. Rest must be paid at Reykjavik in EUR (1,450 EUR).

Group Size

6 participants excluding the mentors.

Cancellation Policy

50% of advance will be deducted if canceled 90 days before the day of departure. Means, we will refund 30,000 INR of the advance 60,000 INR you paid, if you cancel 90 days before the day of departure.

70% of advance will be deducted if canceled 60 days before the day of departure. Means, we will refund you 18,000 INR of the advance 60,000 INR you paid, if you cancel 60 days before the day of departure.

100% of advance will be deducted if canceled 30 days from the day of departure. Means, you will have no refund from the advance 60,000 INR, if you cancel 30 days before the day of departure.

Terms & Conditions

- No refund will be made to any participant if he is unable to complete the tour in case of any health issue or abandoning in the middle.
- If there is trip cancellation from our side (for any emergency cases), 100% refund will be initiated.
- For any pandemic situation, a refund will not be possible.
- Itinerary is subject to change in case of any road blockage or bad weather. We try to alternate with the other options on the spot but no money will refund for any change due to bad weather.
- If you are not interested in any photography activity, we advise you to have patience and let others enjoy, you can wait in the camper.
- If you don't like to share the camper with anyone or you have any night problem, we advise you to opt for a single supplement for more comfortable space and privacy. However in that case you need to take responsibility for driving the camper.
- If you are not interested in Night Photography or star gazing , we advise you to stay in the camper. We don't rush for night Photography, If you join then please respect the passion of other photographers.
- Every participant must have certificates of their 2nd dose of COVID vaccination.

Camper Van

Camper vans in Iceland are typically spacious vehicles meticulously designed for overnight stays, complete with comfortable beds, well-equipped cooking facilities, a cooler for storing fresh food, and heating arrangements for added comfort.

While there isn't a dedicated toilet within the camper, we'll be staying at paid campsites where modern, well-maintained restroom facilities are readily available. These facilities are akin to what you'd find in a hotel. Cleaned and maintained to a high standard. Additionally, it's worth noting that many Icelandic homestays also offer shared toilet facilities, a common practice in this adventurous land. It's important to keep in mind, however, that these facilities differ significantly from the public restrooms we encounter in our everyday lives.

Clothing Recommendation

Iceland's weather is famously varied and often unpredictable, making it crucial to be well-prepared for any circumstances. One can experience brilliant sunshine one moment, only for conditions to swiftly shift to intense winds, bone-chilling cold, overcast skies, heavy rain, or even snow within a matter of minutes. This is why having the appropriate clothing is absolutely essential. As the old saying goes in the mountainous regions of Europe, 'There is no such thing as bad weather, only inappropriate clothing.' With the right attire, one can comfortably embrace even the harshest of weather conditions. In this guide, we've documented some of our favorite ways to dress for success in Iceland.

The key is to layer your clothing. This way, you have full control over the level of warmth you need, simply by adding or shedding layers as necessary.

- Tight inner layer made of thin wool. Preferably merino as it is more breathable, better on soaking moisture and quicker to dry. Trouser and full t-shirt.
- Soft shell pants.
- Waterproof trousers. Preferably the ones with side chains that can be easily taken off. Ski pants will also work if you feel very cold.
- Thicker top layer. Again Merino wool is the best.
- Main layer. Jacket. Preferably down jacket. Preferably something above 700 cuin with above 80% down.
- Windproof and waterproof top upper layer. Gore Tex will be best as it is more breathable.
- Thin inner gloves.
- If your hand has a tendency of getting too cold you can opt for a waterproof mitten.
- If your jacket is not covering the ear or neck properly, it is a good idea to have a woolen cap that can cover the ear.
- Woolen socks.
- A waterproof hiking shoe. Again gore tex is the best. If your feet get too cold, winter hiking boots will be best.
- Take a pair of slippers with you as the shoe will get extremely dirty and you would like not to use it while inside the camper. Best is to open the shoe and use the slipper inside the camper to keep the camper clean. The cleaning of the camper is included in the price, but this is more for not sleeping every night in a muddy camper.
- We will go close to several glaciers and if the sun is shining, you will need UV protected sunglasses. Ideally polarized.
